

#### Member numbers

The total number of members for the year is 563 with the breakdown of 326 full members and 237 subscribers – showing a slight decrease in full members.



By definition a full member is a person who nominated eGSSA as his or her primary branch. A subscriber is a person who selected one of the land based branches as his or her primary branch, but is also subscribing to eGSSA's Genesis and eGGSA privileges.

The 7 couples (husband and wife) were counted as a single unit.

We have 285 Afrikaans speaking members and 278 English speaking members.

Looking back at membership over the last 10 years we see that 21 people have been members for 10 years, a 20% retention rate as 104 people signed up in 2004. As for the rest, 45 people have been members for 9 years, 25 for 8 years; 31 for 7 years; 48 for 6 years and 73 for 5 years.

eGSSA processed 4048 applications during this 10 year period - counting all the full members, Genesis subscribers and renewals.

#### Member communication

E-mails are still the main form of communication. Constant Contact is used to manage bulk e-mail's, it records the number of emails sent, the bounces, the number of clicks and any emails that were forwarded to other people.

The number of emails sent out by Lynn via Constant Contact was 19 506 as opposed to 13 189 last year. This number does not include the responses to individual queries from both the members and the public.

Individual queries are mostly from people wanting help in finding their ancestors or missing relatives, although we also receive a fair number of general queries. Those standing out this year were:

Do you have the plot number my relative is buried in?

Can you give me the directions to the cemetery – I need to attend a funeral this afternoon?

What must I do when I want to exhume a body?

Do I need permission to plant a tree on my mother's grave?

### Genesis by June Barnes

We achieved our goal of producing 4 issues of Genesis in 2013. All except the November issue were sent for distribution by the due date. The November issue was sent for distribution on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December.

The age old situation continues with there being very few articles submitted by our members for consideration by the editorial team. We do not know whether more can be done to improve the situation, but are afraid that this is a universal problem. Several articles were introduced which actively request feedback in the year but very little is forthcoming


### Facebook by June Barnes

The FB page was set up on 22<sup>rd</sup> October 2012. By the beginning of November 2014 there were 530 "likes" registered. Following Alta's campaign to increase the numbers we had an increase of 178 "likes", a total of 708 at the end of December. This is a good result considering we had 563 eGSSA members for 2013.



As part of the 2014 celebrations we set the challenge to make at least one post a day on the page. With contributions from Daan's postcards and some research on the editors' part we should be able to do this. Whether it generates more interest remains to be seen.

The page is very useful for drawing attention to web page up-dates and general announcements. The management team normally submits the news items. We have also tried to change the banner image frequently and thank Richard and Alta for their contributions. The page also attracts posts from individuals asking for information and we have incorporated some of these queries in Genesis. Sometimes there is lively and enthusiastic comments added to posts which is encouraging.



Looking at the figures between 2 Nov and 7 Dec 2013 on average 358 people saw each post. The most seen post in this period was seen by 848 people, which leads to the conclusion that there are a number people who are not "likers" of the page – but still check the postings. This is a good way of promoting what eGSSA.

### eGSSA Website by Richard Ball

Along with Genesis and the eGSSA Facebook page, the eGSSA Branch's web site is our main means of communication with our members and also the area in which our members are most easily able to contribute by providing photographs of gravestones, documents, Bibles and Postcards and also by captioning those photographs once uploaded, for the use of the whole genealogical community.

The eGSSA web site occupies about 180 Gigabytes of disk space and is housed on a dedicated server located in Chicago, USA. The vast majority of this disk space is taken up by our picture library consisting of Gravestones, Archive documents, Bibles, postcards and books.

#### **Backup**

For the 8 years prior to the end of 2013 all the web site data was backed up regularly by the management team member responsible for online services. By that time this was taking several days to do for each backup. After a web site hard disk crash was narrowly averted by the Web server support team it was decided that the approximately 170 GB of data should be backed up regularly and automatically by the service provider for which a monthly charge is made. Backups are now run by Future Hosting's automated backup system and done every second day with the backups stored off site.

#### **Visitors**

When looking at web site statistics, the important ones are the number of visitors and the number of visits.

A visitor is you or me accessing the web site. A visit consists of one session of whatever duration where a visitor stays looking at the web site. You will see that visitors and their visits increased by around 50% during 2013.

## Archive Photographic Services by Richard Ball

A total of 569 orders for photographs of documents at the Archives were received; 384 from GSSA members and 185 from non-members.

With the help of our doughty photographers and the volunteers who collect, itemize, process, load and invoice these orders, 90% were completed within 6 weeks or less.

### Bibles Project by Richard Ball

In September photographs of 64 Bibles from the Albany Museum containing family information, photographed by Johan Hefer for eGSSA and 24 similar Bibles from the Potchefstroom Library collection, photographed by Dirk Bloem for the North West Branch, were added to the Bible collection.

In October photographs of the family information contained in a further 53 Bibles from the collection of the Voortrekker-Msunduzi Museum, Pietermaritzburg were. These were photographed and contributed by John Deare of the Natal Midland Branch of the GSSA.

Process changes and acquisition of new software were done to upload post cards from an Apple notebook.

1471 cards were uploaded to bring the year end total at 2698 cards – more than double last year's numbers.

Promotion for contributing more cards and introducing the service, were done on various Facebook interest groups.

### South African Records Transcribed by Corney Keller

In 2013 we continued where we left off in 2012; expanding on the existing sections and adding one or two new ones including indexes to FamilySearch (LDS) online images.

#### **Amsterdam Classis**

No new material was added to this section. Some articles still have some transcription or typing errors, which are revised and edited as they come to light.

#### **Church Registers**


The transcription of 'Cape Town Baptisms 1695-1712' was completed in early 2013. We set the goal to transcribe 'Cape Town Baptisms 1713-1742' and 'Cape Town Marriages 1713-1756' completely in 2013. The baptisms were completed by September 2013. Unfortunately the marriages were not completed. By October 2013 the year 1747 was completed. After that the transcriptions stagnated due to my personal situation.

#### Muster Rolls of free men


Containing 14 articles by the end of 2012, the number of articles in this section was almost doubled in 2013 and now comprises 24 in total. The following years were added: 1665; 1666-67; 1667; 1670; 1671; 1672; 1673; 1674; 1675 and 1679. All were transcribed by Richard Ball. The Muster Rolls (monsterrollen), preserved in the form of transcripts in the Cape Archives as VC 39-55 and 103, were apparently yearly lists of the inhabitants at the Cape, drawn up by Dutch East India Company (VOC) officials, and sent to the authorities in the Netherlands where they were preserved. These are copies done by hand at the end of the 19th Century by George McCall Theal, from the records preserved in the VOC archives at The Hague, Netherlands.

2013 also saw a new subsection of Muster Rolls of free men named "Den Haag Lists of Freeburgers." A new project was started to investigate the provenance of the VC lists by visiting the National Archive in The Hague and to sift through the papers and letters that arrived from the Cape. Each year may contain between 400 and a 1000+ folios (800 to 2000 pages). Most years are indexed with a register in the first part of the packet. So far 25 inventories for the years 1655-1683 has been investigated. The registers indicate that almost all years had a list of free men. It appears however that almost all of the list were removed from the packets at one time or another and never returned. Only two list were still in place; that of 1673 and 1679. Both these list have been published in this new subsection in tabular form and as downloadable transcript. During the research, a list of all free men who had an account at the company for the year 1681 was discovered. This 'Vrijboek' sheds new light on quite a few progenitors as far as the year of arrival, ship and occupation is concerned. This list can also be found in this subsection.

### Indexes (Stellenbosch NGK Registers)

The section on Stellenbosch church registers was significantly expanded and renewed. Except for the existing baptisms for the period 1688-1732 which linked to the eGSSA BDM Project, all the others, new and existing, are now presented in a searchable tabular. This was effected in March 2013 and comprise the following:

- Stellenbosch NGK baptisms 1732-1788
- Stellenbosch NGK baptisms 1788 to 1815
- Stellenbosch NGK baptisms 1765 to 1794
- Stellenbosch NGK marriage register 1689 to 1788
- Stellenbosch NGK marriage register 1788 to 1815

The data was compiled and made available to eGSSA by Ockert Malan. Ockert also made his article "Duplikaat-inskrywings in Stellenbosse Huweliksregister: Waar lê die fout?" available and can be found in this section.

#### Indexes to LDS images (FamilySearch)

A new section containing only indexes to FamilySearch images was added in 2013. The first part added was the so called 'Cape Province, Civil Deaths, 1895-1972'. With help of various transcribers this section grew to more than 55.000 records. Our thanks to Lyn Paul, Carol Chapman, Patricia Putter, Gillian Mauchan, Walter Renze, Ellen Stanton, Darryl Allwright, Leanne Starkey and Ockert Malan.

By August 2013 the data sent in by indexers stagnated with only one indexer remaining. The reason may be that FamilySearch has launched its own indexing project for the Cape Civil Deaths. It is probable that the indexers are now devoting their time there.

#### Also added were

- Grahamstown Methodist Commemoration Church baptisms 1876-1930, and
- an index on the index of Rustenburg Gereformeerde Gemeente 1859-1910.

#### 2014 and beyond

The main aim will be to continue the transcription of the Cape Town Church registers up to the end of the VOC period. Secondly to continue with the research in The Hague and publication of lists of free men and whatever else comes to light. Thirdly to stand open for any new material and suggestions to improve on the site and make it even more valuable to researchers.

The transcription of documents is an on-going process and depends largely on the availability of (copies of) original documents and transcribers.

The 1820 Settler Correspondence Section has, by its very nature, remained unchanged apart from a few minor corrections, but still gets three to four hundred hits daily.


### The Newspaper Section by Sue Mackay

The Newspaper Section is constantly growing, with daily updates to the Eastern Province Herald holdings and also modern BMDs from several papers. Historical extracts are now complete for the Cape Frontier Times (1840-1844 and 1847-1853) and the Queenstown Free Press (1885-1898). Some of these editions have received over 1,000 hits, and the Newspaper Section is generally very well used, with 795 visitors on 29 December alone.

### Passenger lists: Primary Sources by Richard Wolfaardt



We did not transcribe many passenger lists this year due to the fact that we do not have a proof reader. Our volunteers are getting off the ship one by one because they are busy with other projects.

2013 saw us only transcribe and add 102 passengers' names to the list bringing the total number of transcribed names to 26574.

### Stamouers by Annelie Els



The Stamouers.com web site was created by André van Rensburg. When he found himself unable to continue to maintain it, André passed it into the trust of eGSSA for maintenance. After lots of delays the new website was launched at the end of 2012. Our thanks to Richard Ball for all his efforts in updating the website again in 2013. The new web software has made it easier to add new entries and update current entries with any submitted information. Annelie Els was appointed as editor in Sep 2013.

The web site attempts to provide genealogical and other information on all those immigrants who founded a family in South Africa. It is entirely dependent on contributions from those who have the required information.

All immigrants are eligible for inclusion including arrivals up to the late nineteenth century and we are looking at expanding the database.

### Outreach Program by Alta Griffiths

Our outreach program has grown quite a bit. We took part in various other exhibitions to showcase our hobby and where possible involved the land based branches. The workshops and exhibitions are normally well received and tend to create a lot of excitement. This is also a great opportunity to meet existing members and to sign new members up.

Where we previously relied on the kindness of the Western Cape branch for the use of their posters, this year we had our own sets printed. The posters are helpful when trying to explain what data can be found in the various resources.

We would like to see a further expansion of the shop in the coming year. There is a demand for genealogical products and we want to encourage our members to consider the shop as a means of distributing their published research. Our focus is on DVD's and CD's as the postage on books is very dear. A total of 330 products were sold during the year.

Our sincerest thanks to Richard Ball for cataloguing the eShop items and to Carol and Lüdwic Beneke who run the shop for us so efficiently. Lüdwic had to do more than one post office run on some days.

### Finances by Carol Beneke

This financial report covers the period beginning 1 January 2013 and ending 31 December 2013. Both the income and expenditure of eGSSA increased during 2013.

eGSSA has an ABSA account used to conduct general business and a FNB account opened with the sole purpose to accommodate our PayPal business once the South African PayPal account has been opened. Currently the FNB account credit card is only used for postage. All payments in foreign exchange are accommodated in a temporary ex-PayPal investment account. We are therefor running three bank accounts. These three accounts are consolidated in one Income and Expenditure Account.

eGSSA has a surplus of R22 102.38 for this financial year.

- The ABSA account increased by R 28,966.16 and
- The FNB account increased by R17 088.85
- and the ex-PayPal account decreased by R23 952.13.

A copy of the Income and Expenditure Statement for the period 1 January 2013 to 31 December 2013 of the ABSA account, the FNB account, the ex-PayPal account and the consolidated account is attached hereto as Annexure A.

#### SALE OF GSSA AND eGSSA PRODUCTS

The eShop sells GSSA products as well as genealogy products for private individuals. eGSSA makes a profit of approximately 10% on the sale. In some cases eGSSA acts as a retailer selling genealogy products for private individuals and who do their own packing and shipping of the items.

eGSSA sold GSSA products to the value of R29 450.00. eGSSA sold contracted products to the value of R24 524.90.

A larger than normal amount of stock was purchased in November 2013 in order to accommodate the sale in our e-shop of the eGSSA products.

#### ARCHIVE DOCUMENTS

Archive photos to the value of R 81 387.00 were purchased this year, compared to R 51,038.14 for 2012.

#### **WEB SITE**

The total cost for online services for 2013 was R 44 475.10 and is, as to be expected, our main

expense. This amount includes the webserver charges, domain registrations, software subscriptions, automated backup and the email service.

#### **THE 2015 PREMIUMS**

It is proposed that no increase in the eGSSA branch membership fees for 2015 need be considered.
